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
# The ESEJ standard is developed according to the international IMRaD standard

# 1. Types of scientific articles

N⁰	Type of article	Meaning of article
1	Research	In scientific articles, authors report the results of their own
		research, so they are considered primary sources. Scientific
		articles should clearly indicate that the authors conducted
		research, surveys, experiments, collected data, and etc.
2	Review	Review articles are also scientific, but not empirical. A review
		is a critical assessment of existing research in a particular
		field. They assess the state of the literature on a particular
		topic and suggest steps for future research. Thus, such
		articles provide good reviews, and a bibliography can lead to
		empirical research on declared theme. The phrase 'literature
		review' usually appears in the title, abstract, and introduction
		of the article.
3	Theoretical	Theoretical articles aim to contribute to the theoretical
		foundations of specific areas of research. The articles use
		terms such as 'concept', 'theoretical basis', or 'model'.
4	Editorial	Editorials often appear in academic journals. They are not
		considered academic, but they can help find more sources
		for declared research. They are usually written in a literary
		style. They should give their opinion, but not be prescriptive.
		The word 'editorial' is often used in the title of the article.


The ESEJ standard provides for the publication of a research, review, or theoretical articles. The editorial type of articles is not accepted, as they are not academic.

# 2. The general structure of a scientific article in the format of ESEJ Standard



This structure is mandatory for all three types of articles that are accepted for consideration by the Editorial Board of the international scientific journal "European Scientific e-Journal".

## Article title

- 1. The line from the author's personal data is skipped.
- 2. It starts with a capital letter.
- 3. The option of 'Enter' is not used for the artificial transfer of words.
- 4. Font size is 16.
- 5. Font weight is bold.
- 6. A line space is placed after the header.

#### Abstract

- 1. It is written after the title on the left from the beginning of the line.
- 2. The subtitle 'Abstract' and a colon.
- 3. The text of the abstract starts on the next line.
- 4. The text of the abstract usually begins with the phrases "The article describes...", 'In the article, the author...' or 'The author of the article...'. However, you can offer personal variant similar them.
- 5. The volume is from 300 to 600 characters with spaces, i.e. 5-8 lines.
- 6. A line space is placed after the abstract text.

## An example of abstract design

#### Abstract:

The article describes the conservation measures carried out to preserve the memorial tombstone of the 18th century. The material of the slab is special limestone. The complexity of such events lies in the fact that horizontally lying tombstones are an excellent springboard for various destructive processes that affect the preservation of the monument's material.

#### **ATTENTION:**

# Keywords

- 1. They are written to the left from the beginning of the line.
- 2. The subtitle of 'Keywords' and a colon.
- 3. The next line contains a list of words and phrases.
- 4. There can be only the words used in the text of the article, preferably 2-5 times.
- 5. The volume is from 6 to 12 words.
- 6. Double line space is placed after the keywords.










# Structure of an article source of information






# Structure of the Internet source of information

# 6. Requirements of appendix

Images should be from 1/4 to 1/2 of the page space. Recommend to do size of every image by 150-300 Kb.

Editorial board will do corrections if you cannot do this correctly!

- 2. All the fields are 2 cm.
- 3. Page numbering is bottom right.
- 4. Font is New Roman Times.
- 5. Font size is 14.
- 6. Line spacing is 1.5 (one-and-a-half)
